



Foreigners in The Czech Republic

The Basic Structure

- 1 131 197 foreigners (37,108 more than a year earlier) – more than 10 % of Czech Republic population
- more than half of the foreigners (54% were citizens of Ukraine, 11% were citizens of Slovakia, 6% were citizens of Vietnam and 3% were citizens of Russia.
- more than a third of foreigners (35%) resided in the Czech Republic on the basis of a permanent type of residence, while the remaining 65% of all foreigners resided in the Czech Republic on the basis of one of the temporary types of residence
- EU citizens made up 21% of all foreigners (235,699 people).




Foreigner employment in The Czech Republic

The Basic Structure

- over 845,000 foreigners from EU/EEA (European Economic Area) and from the third-countries were registered in an employment relationship in the Czech Republic (cca 20 % share of all employment)
- that is an increase compared to the previous year
- Citizens of Ukraine (36%) and Slovakia (25%) dominate, followed by Vietnamese. Most foreigners work in the manufacturing industry, construction and transport. Overall, foreigners form a key part of the labor market.




- Most foreigners work in the manufacturing industry, construction and transport
- business permits: 131,738 foreigners with permits (an increase of 13,355).
- Most common nationality:
 - Ukraine: > 300,000 people.
 - Slovakia: > 215,000 people.
 - Vietnam: over 21,000 people (in business).




■ The third-country foreigners, all categories

— Share the third-country foreigners of all inhabitants, %



The third-country foreigners share of all foreigners living in the territory of The Czech Republic





The Third-country foreigners- gainfully employed having a paying job or being selfemployed




Third country foreigners employed by type of economic activity (agric., industry and services)

Impact of the foreigners presence - the public perception


